Keynote Speaker:

Dr Mandie Shean. BA Psychology (Hons), BA Ed, Ph.D.

Dr Mandie Shean from ECU's School of Education is a childhood resilience expert and former teacher. Over many years she has developed strategies to help young people build their resilience. In this presentation she will provide a theoretical framework for developing resilience, with an emphasis on practical ways of developing young people's resilience. Attendees will learn ways of managing young people's challenges, developing their self-worth, building quality relationships, setting boundaries and promoting effective coping skills. These skills are simple to implement and are also beneficial for the well-being of teachers.

Vince Bradley BA LL.D. Senior Associate Lawyer, Leach Legal, Family Lawyers.

This presentation aims to provide an overview of some of the main areas of family law including Parenting, Property settlement, Spousal Maintenance, Divorce, De facto jurisdiction and Injunctions. A summary of the legislation, together with either precedents or hypothetical examples will be provided to explain each of the areas of law and the implications for families.

Linda is a powerful advocate for law reform, social justice and the rights of women and children. She established the Valuing Children Initiative in 2016 and continues this work to create a greater societal awareness of children and their needs to ensure that they are able to maximise their potential. She is a previous Director of the Social Security Appeals Tribunal and a Legal Member of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal. She has also been a Member of the Legislative Council of the WA State Parliament.
